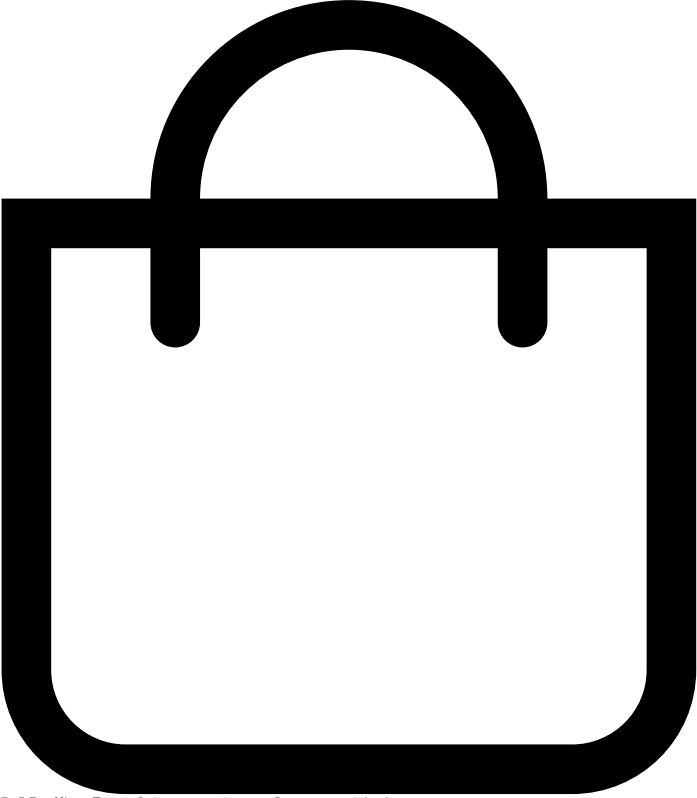


3-Day Nizwa & Surroundings Tour

📍 Nizwa, Ad Dakhiliyah Governorate, 611, Oman



📍 **3-Day Nizwa Tour** explores the most historic and scenic places of Oman’s Ad Dakhiliyah Governorate—balancing forts, canyons, terraced villages, and high-plateau farms. From *Nizwa Fort & Souq* to UNESCO-listed *Bahla Fort*, elegant *Jabreen Castle*, the adobe lanes of *Al Hamra*, the falaj-irrigated gardens of *Misfat Al Abriyeen*, the epic rim of *Jabal Shams*, cool-air *Jebel Akhdar*, and oasis-rich *Birkat Al Mouz*—this *3-Day Nizwa Tour* gives you depth, variety, and unforgettable views. If you love culture, geology, mountain weather, and timeless Omani hospitality, this three-day journey is the perfect match. 📍

📍 **3-Day Nizwa Tour: Destinations Covered**

📍 **Nizwa Fort & Souq**

Built in the 17th century by Imam Sultan bin Saif Al Ya’rubi, Nizwa Fort’s massive circular tower commands sweeping views over date palms and the Hajar range. Angled staircases, trap doors, and “murder holes” reveal ingenious Omani defense design. Next door, the Souq brims with silver jewelry, khanjar daggers, pottery, halwa, spices, and—on select mornings—a lively livestock market. Arrive early for softer light and authentic bargaining scenes. Rooftop battlements glow at golden hour; small heritage rooms and craft sections add context for culture lovers.

📍 **Bahla Fort (UNESCO World Heritage Site)**

Bahla is Oman’s largest mud-brick fortification, a masterpiece of earthen architecture with origins in the 13th-14th centuries under the Banu Nebhanh dynasty. Recent restoration reveals vast walls, inner keeps, and watchtowers guarding a once-prosperous oasis. Around town, pottery workshops continue centuries-old techniques—look for hand-thrown jars and traditional ovens. The scale of the ramparts and the desert light make Bahla one of the most atmospheric heritage sites in the country—an essential stop on any *3-Day Nizwa Tour*.

📍 **Jabreen Castle**

Unlike the defensive posture of Nizwa and Bahla, **Jabreen Castle** was designed as a palace of knowledge and the arts. Painted ceilings, carved doors, and airy courtyards showcase refined Ya’rubi aesthetics. Don’t miss the Sun & Moon Hall—scholars once studied astronomy here, and the lattice windows cast intricate patterns across the floor. Even an exterior photo stop captures the elegance, but an interior visit rewards fans of Omani art, inscriptions, and 17th-century domestic life.

📍 **Al Hamra Old Village**

Al Hamra’s lanes form a living gallery of mud-brick architecture. Multi-story homes sit on stone plinths with palm-trunk beams above; many are over 400 years old. Narrow alleys funnel breezes to cool interiors—ancient “passive AC.” For a hands-on peek at traditions, the Bait Al Safa living museum demonstrates bread baking, coffee roasting, and weaving. At sunset, the adobe warms to honeyed tones as locals stroll between orchards and falaj channels.

📍 **Misfat Al Abriyeen**

Perched on a mountainside above a deep wadi, **Misfat** is famed for terraced gardens irrigated by the ancient *falaj* system (recognized by UNESCO for cultural value). Wander stone paths beneath palms, hear flowing water, and admire mud-and-stone houses clinging to the slope. Small cafés serve Omani coffee with terrace views. Dress modestly and keep voices low; mornings bring soft light over the palms, while late afternoon silhouettes the terraces against the cliffs.

📍 **Jabal Shams — “The Grand Canyon of Oman”**

Oman’s highest massif delivers jaw-dropping vistas over Wadi Nakhr. The famed Balcony Walk skirts dramatic cliffs and overlooks hamlets tucked on ledges far below. Temperatures are cooler than the plains year-round—pack layers and sturdy shoes. Viewpoints along the rim provide safe, well-trodden vantage points for photography. The stark geology—ancient seabeds now standing vertical—tells a gripping tectonic story that shaped the Hajar Mountains.

📍 **Jebel Akhdar (Green Mountain)**

The Saiq Plateau’s orchards and stone villages showcase high-altitude agriculture: pomegranates, peaches, walnuts, and legendary Damask roses distilled into prized rose water each spring. Terraced farms follow contours with dry-stone walls built over generations. Trails between villages like Al Ayn and Wadi Bani Habib reveal cliffside homes and sweeping valley views. Thanks to elevation, Jebel Akhdar enjoys pleasant summers; blossoms and harvests add color and aroma in the shoulder seasons.

📍 **Birkat Al Mouz**

Meaning “Pool of Bananas,” this oasis blends heritage ruins, date and banana plantations, and the restored Bayt Al Redidah fort at the base of the ascent to Jebel Akhdar. Ancient *falaj* channels lace the groves, demonstrating sustainable irrigation that has supported life here for centuries. Stroll the old quarter’s mud-brick remains for atmospheric photos, then follow palm-shaded paths to plantations—an ideal warm-up stop before the cooler mountain air above.

📍 **Visiting Tips for the 3-Day Nizwa Tour**

- 📍 Arrive early to forts and souqs for softer light and fewer crowds.
- 📍 Dress modestly in villages and heritage sites; respect local customs.
- 📍 Wear supportive footwear for village paths and canyon viewpoints.
- 📍 Hydrate year-round; pack layers for high-altitude chill on Jabal Shams.
- 📍 Golden hour at Nizwa Fort and rim lookouts offers spectacular images.

Preserve sensitive sites: stay on marked paths, don’t climb fragile adobe, and avoid litter. Ask before photographing people, especially in villages and souqs. Choose locally run cafés and purchase crafts directly—your rials support heritage preservation.

Day 1 : Explore Nizwa: Culture & Forts

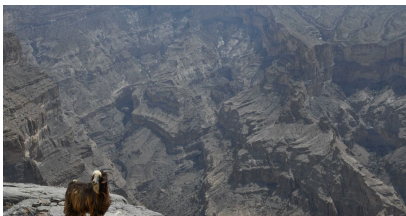


Day 1 - Explore Nizwa: Culture & Forts

- Lunch break (optional, not included)
- Drive to Bahla Fort - UNESCO World Heritage Site
- Photo stop at Jabreen Castle
- Evening visit to Al Hamra Old Town - traditional mud-brick houses
- Drop off at hotel / accommodation

- Pickup from hotel

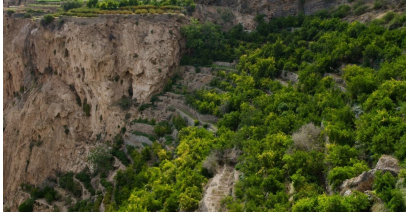
- Visit Misfat Al Abriyeen - walking tour through falaj irrigation system

- Check out and drive to Jebel Akhdar (4WD included)

- Stop at Birkat Al Mouz ruins and banana farms
- Drive through Saiq Plateau – explore terraced farms and cool climate
- Visit rose water distilleries (seasonal)
- Optional lunch (not included)
- Return to Nizwa or drop-off location by late afternoon
